SEVERE WEATHER

Watches, Warnings and Alerts



A watch means that severe weather is possible. Take this time to prepare and locate safe, interior rooms away from windows, as well as gather emergency supplies.



WARNING

A warning means a severe weather event such as a tornado or flood has been confirmed in the area. There is imminent danger to life and property. Immediately seek refuge in the safest location possible.



THE INTERNET

Check weather.gov on a desktop or mobile device for real-time updates. Warnings can come from local news outlets or emergency management offices on social media, websites or apps. Follow UPD on social media for updates on weather in our area.



TEXT ALERTS

Make sure your smartphone is Wireless Emergency Alerts enabled to push real-time weather alerts. Jack Alert lets the SFA community know about any weather or otherwise perceived threats. Click on the "Sign up for Campus Alerts" tab on your mySFA account to sign up. The Nacogdoches community can sign up for free **NacWise Alerts** at nacwise.com to receive alerts from the city, or download the app.



OUTDOOR SIRENS

Sirens are located on the SFA campus and will sound in the event of severe weather or active danger. Immediately seek shelter, monitor official social media outlets for updates and remain in place until the all-clear is given. Siren tests occur the first Wednesday of the month at 11:55 a.m.



LOCAL TV AND RADIO

Local news stations like KTRE, KLTV or KETK broadcast official warnings, plus forecasts and storm trackers. These stations can also be found on social media and have apps that push weather notifications to your smartphone.
