TEC Sec 54.5202

- Added to Texas Education Code in 2015
- SFASU authorized to charge an initial amount not to exceed \$10/SCH (statute limits at 15 SCH)
- The Athletics Fee may be increased only:
 - if approved by a majority vote of the students participating in a general student election held for that purpose or,
 - if the amount of the increase does not exceed five percent, by a majority vote of the legislative body of the student government of the university

Impact on Student Service Fee

- Eliminate \$960,000 funding of Athletics
- \$120 increase per semester in Tuition and Fees (for students enrolled in 12 or more Semester Credit Hours)

Conversation Timeline

- 10/9/2023 Student Body Vice President emailed VPFA regarding the process required to instate an athletics fee
- October 2023 March 2024 Ongoing conversations with UT System regarding Athletics Fee
- March 2024 Fee Proposals Due
- 3/5/2024 VPSA and SGA Advisor discuss draft resolution and timeline
- 3/18/2024 President's Cabinet discussion regarding FY25 Athletics Fee and referendum process
- **3/18/2024** VPSA met with SGA Executive Board regarding process

Process Timeline March 20 – April 4

- **3/20/2024** Informational session I (VPFA Presentation)
- **3/27/2024** Informational session II (Athletics Presentation)
- 4/3/2024 Informational session III (Recap, Q&A)
- 4/4/2024 4/5/2024 Potential Referendum (campus-wide student vote to gather the official opinion of the student body)
- Fall 2024 Athletics Fee would begin being charged (if referendum passes)
